CDP - In what has been one of the biggest projects we have undertaken here at St Peter's in the last 20 years, the Capital Development Plan to build a brand-new Early Childhood Centre - comprising of three Kindy and three Pre Primary classes - was completed at the end of Term Three this year. This great new infrastructure will support the school's mission to provide a contemporary learning environment where students have the opportunity to flourish in a high-quality 21st century Catholic educational setting.

Not only do we have brand new classrooms, but we also have the addition of a redeveloped play space for our students in Kindy to Year Two. The addition of this play space, coupled with a well-developed and structured timetable, has allowed flexibility for students in all year levels to have access to their own oval spaces, along with the playgrounds, basketball court and quiet area.

Students are enjoying the expanded areas for outdoor activities, fostering creativity and physical fitness. To enhance this experience further, provisions are in place next year to upgrade playgrounds and equipment, along with the installation of shade sails in key areas. These shade sails will provide much-needed protection from the sun, ensuring our students can play comfortably throughout the year.

We have been extremely fortunate to go through a Capital Development Plan that was built on time and within budget. I would like to extend my thanks to everyone that was involved in the process:

To Nick, Sean and all the crew at Metricon, and to Chloe and Luis, our architects from EIW.

To all the school leaders and finance team involved in the project. The vision to build a much-needed Early Childhood Centre, combined with their hard work and extensive hours dedicated to the project, ensured that the build had minimal impact on the teaching, learning and daily operations of the school.

And to all the teachers and students for being so flexible throughout the build. At times, it required changes to timetables and play spaces, but it was done with little fuss.

It was a TRUE testament of UNITY.

SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM - As Assistant Principal of Religious Education, I was extremely fortunate to oversee the Sacramental Program this year.

St Peter's Primary School works closely with the Parish to support the students and their parents by providing knowledge and understanding of the Catholic faith, so they are fully prepared to receive the Sacrament. The Sacramental Programs begins with Reconciliation (Year Three), First Holy Communion (Year Four) and Confirmation (Year Six). This year, we had 237 students participate in the Sacramental Program, along with 15 students who joined from the Parish. This is a testament to the number of Catholic students we enrol here at St Peter's Primary school.

A huge thank you to our Sacramental Co-ordinator, Marina Tassone, for the time and effort she puts in to ensuring each child has a memorable sacramental experience in the presence of God. Marina always has the students' best interests in mind. Together with her husband Mario, they work tirelessly to bring the church to life for each Sacrament.

Each Mass was a delightful opportunity to gather as a community. We enjoyed celebrating with the candidates and their families, sharing in their joy, and expressing our support and congratulations.

I extend my deepest gratitude to Father Jeronimo and the teachers involved for their contributions to the success of these celebrations. To the volunteers who helped with preparations, the choir for their inspiring music, and everyone who attended to offer their support—your efforts made these events truly special.

To our Sacramental candidates, may they continue to grow in faith, love, and wisdom.

NAPLAN - In 2023, the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) reset the NAPLAN measurement scale. In both 2023 and 2024, student achievement in NAPLAN has been reported using proficiency standards for each assessment area at each year level. The four proficiency levels are: exceeding, strong, developing and needs additional support.

St Peter's Primary School consistently demonstrates a high performance across all assessments. In 2024, we are proud to celebrate NAPLAN results which show that, in both Years Three and Five across all areas which are: Reading, Writing, Spelling, Grammar & Numeracy, St Peter's Primary School is above CEWA schools, State schools and the National average in all areas.

LITERACY SUPPORT - Although we maintain our consistently strong results, we are always refining what we do to ensure the best outcomes for our students. In 2024 we restructured our literacy support programs to include Heggarty, MiniLit and MacqLit. Heggarty is a whole class synthetic phonics program currently run in our Early Years classrooms which supports the development of both reading and writing skills. For children who are experiencing challenges with reading progress, best practice is early intervention. MiniLit and MacqLit offer frequent, structured intervention lessons for identified students in Years One to Six.

EMU - St Peter's currently runs numeracy intervention programs under the leadership of Mrs Emily Welsh. Our EMU (Extending Maths Understanding) program is accessible for those students in Year One who have shown signs of mathematical vulnerability. This

program targets Counting, Place Value, Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division. The focus is strongly on solving "Hard Thinking Tasks", encouraging students to use efficient mathematical strategies. In 2025, we are looking to increase the number of children who can access this program.

BOND BLOCKS - In 2025, St Peter's also looks forward to launching the Bond Blocks Program – This will be implemented with students from Years Two to Six. Bond Blocks is a research-informed intervention program that incorporates high impact teaching strategies such as Multiple Exposure and Explicit Teaching. The program builds on maths skills such as doubling, halving and Bonds to 10 and 20. Students will have short, sharp, targeted sessions with the focus being on basic facts used for addition and subtraction.

AQUINAS - The AQUINAS program is a wonderful opportunity designed to meet the advanced learning needs of students who demonstrate high academic or creative abilities. AQUINAS aims to provide more challenging and enriching learning experiences beyond the standard curriculum. This often includes advanced coursework, creative projects, critical thinking activities, or opportunities to pursue individual interests in depth. The students identified for the AQUINAS program are withdrawn from the classroom for two lessons a week across Years Three to Six. AQUINAS is available to students identified as high potential students based on various criteria, such as standardized test scores, teacher recommendations and academic performance. Students are identified for the AQUINAS program at their point of need, ensuring support is provided when they demonstrate advanced learning abilities or require additional challenges. I thank Julia O'Meara for the incredible work she does with these students.

SPECIALISTS - Throughout 2024, our specialist programs in Music, Italian, Visual Arts, Dance/Drama, Science and Physical Education have continued to enrich our students' education. These classes provided our children with skills and diverse learning experiences, sparking a love of learning and exploration.

SOCIAL EMOTIONAL - Social emotional skills are an important area of growth at St Peter's. This Year, two new programs have been introduced at St Peter's: the URStrong Friendology program across the whole school and Kimochis in our Early Years. These programs help to develop students' emotional literacy, friendship skills and resilience. I would like to thank our wellbeing team, led by Mrs Shelley Gaglia, for their commitment to supporting students and staff with the implementation of these programs and look forward to seeing them continue to flourish into 2025.
