School Information

Contextual information

St Peter's is an established triple stream Catholic co-educational primary school situated within 10 kilometers of the Perth CBD. The school has an enrolment of 756 students from Pre Kindy to Year 6 and draws the majority of students from within the parish of Bedford/Inglewood.

The staff provides an integrated curriculum for all students with Religious Education as the focus. The curriculum draws together the concepts, knowledge, skills, attitudes and values in developing the competencies of expressing, investigating, communicating, creating and reflecting. There is a range of specialist programs including Music, Physical Education, Dance/Drama, Italian, Reading Recovery, Extending Mathematical Understanding and Gifted and Talented.

The school endeavours to establish close links with parents that result in greater involvement by parents in schooling and other activities; better connection between parents and teachers; community building; and ultimately, better outcomes for students. The school also enjoys a strong relationship with the local St Peter's parish and parish priest, Fr Jeronimo Flamenco.


The school completed a School Climate Survey in 2022, which included feedback from students, teachers and parents. The feedback from this survey highlighted our strengths to be:

Annual School Improvement

As detailed in the Principal's report from the Annual General Meeting.

It is an honour and a privilege to be a part of the St Peter's school community, and to be inspired by the love of God that is experienced through all members of our community. This year was another year where we, as a community, have faced the challenges incurred by the COVID-19 pandemic. As a result, there have been many changes and pivoting required of us all, but what has not changed is our commitment to nurturing, supporting, and educating every student, and working together under the umbrella of TRUE.

The COVID-19 pandemic has taught all of us that we cannot take our stability, unity and all that we have worked hard for as a school, for granted. The pandemic has also heightened the need for all of us to cultivate an attitude of continual learning and improvement. This continual striving for improvement, or Growth Mindset, has been a key driver of St Peter's success. It is why we keep seeking ways to ensure our pedagogy remains relevant and innovative, despite the volatile, uncertain, complex and ambiguous world we live in; and this directly impacts our students.

'The TRUE Inquiry Model' has been a focus throughout this year. This model permeates all our planning and lesson development from Kindergarten to Year Six. Our students need to be resilient, adaptable and global in their outlook. They must feel a sense of curiosity, and eagerness to learn, as they pursue learning throughout their lifetime. We have continued the Inquiry pedagogy in Mathematics, and ensured that there is a focus on launch, explore and summarise across the school. Launch the problem giving only the information students need, explore through enabling prompts and summarise with explicit teaching and reflecting.

At St Peter's, we seek your support and partnership in your child's learning journey. We work together to ensure that our St Peter's students learn to be organised, selfdiscover and selfmonitor, have fun, and bounce back from failures as they discover their interests and talents. Most importantly, never cease to believe in themselves as they navigate their way through the crests and troughs of school life.

Our whole school wellbeing program, coupled with our community building initiatives such as Run Club, have been a deliberate act on our behalf to serve our community with heart, care and respect. The response has been overwhelmingly positive, and many stories have been shared about students and families enjoying fun and fitness together. We believe that, with a Growth Mindset, self-regulation strategies and Inquiry skills, our St Peter's students will be ready for life as they embed TRUE in their daily living and learning.

Our NAPLAN data once again is significantly higher than the national average and like Catholic schools. Whilst managing online learning and student absence due to isolation requirements, along with the development of our Inquiry pedagogy we have managed to maintain our strong results. A true credit to a staff who is clear in our school improvement strategies and cohesive in planning and delivery. All data can be accessed through the My School website and is also accessible on our school website.

I am grateful that all our Teachers and Education Assistants have continued their best efforts in ensuring quality teaching and learning in both face-to-face and online learning. Students are provided with as many opportunities as possible for holistic development and a quality school learning experience, despite the various restrictions and disruptions due to Covid. To help our staff cope with the additional teaching/work demands and administrative tasks, we have spent much effort in ensuring adequate staffing, optimising staff deployment/workload, prioritising school programmes, and organising staff development and wellbeing programs.

This year, we have created new collaborative spaces and upgraded learning areas. Our commitment to the performing arts is reflected in dedicated music tutor rooms and a refurbished Music Room. Our Library space has now been refurbished to cater for Collaborative and Inquiry learning. We are now able to house the school indoors for assembly, if required. Something we have been unable to do on this school site. We are sincerely grateful for the support of our P&F in purchasing the furniture for this new area in our school. After an extensive planning process, we will see the building begin on our new Early Childhood Learning Centre in the coming year. We are very excited by the new opportunities provided by this new capital development to meet National Quality Standards and deliberately ensure the footprint of our play areas remains the same. I sincerely thank our SAC who has worked alongside leadership for the past two years on this project.

It is my heartfelt privilege to serve as the Principal of St Peter's. I sincerely believe that our school environment, that is collaborative and draws on the strength of all stakeholders, fosters a positive school climate that makes a difference in the lives of all our students at St Peter's. We remain the school of choice in our region because of this. As I embark on my new role at CEWA for two years as a School Improvement Advisor, I know I will very much miss this great community and I wish all students and staff all the very best in their future endeavours.

To the staff and students, I thank you for the high standard of work produced in the classrooms, your commitment to work together to make a difference, your friendship and laughs throughout our wonderful year together. I will truly miss the fabulous team we have co created to achieve success.
