Treasurer's Report</p>	<p>Graham presented his commentary:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Pina Hutcheson, Tracy Arnold, Brett Blanchard and Graham Forrest were introduced as the finance committee.</li> <li>- Special mention was made of Tracy's contribution since joining the school part way through the year.</li> <li>- Acknowledgement was made of Kelly Brown's (former Finance Officer) contribution and congratulations extended to her new role.</li> <li>- Special mention was also made of Brett joining the committee part way through the year to assist with the transition of the Treasurer role.</li> <li>- Pina was noted for demonstrating tight fiscal management.</li> <li>- The school enrolment numbers were tabled (please refer to Treasurer's powerpoint presentation).</li> <li>- Graham proceeded to explain the cash position of the school and the components of the budget.</li> <li>- The opening balance as at 1/1/2019 was \$752,300 and the cash result is anticipated to finish on 31/12/2019 at \$740,387.</li> <li>- A significant portion of the school finances depends on the maintenance of enrolment numbers, while Commonwealth and State Government funding provided the remainder of the funds.</li> <li>- As in previous years, the greatest expenditure is teaching staff costs.</li> <li>- Budget was based on a 2.1% increase.</li> <li>- The Board has approved the budget and a fee increase of 6% which is based on CEWA recommendation.</li> </ul>

8. Principal's Report	<p>Pina presented her commentary:</p> <p><b>General reflection and gratitude:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Reflection on the school year where staff and students made 2019 the year of defining who they were through their words and actions, in living the core values of Trust, Respect, Unity and Excellence.</li><li>- Gratitude was expressed to the school community who completed the recent Climate Survey. The feedback will help refine the Strategic Plan in 2020 and will be shared with the community early in 2020.</li><li>- Appreciation was expressed for the way the students voluntarily demonstrate Christian witness in the school community. This year, the school community worked together to show their love and concern for Regan Smolic and childhood cancer.</li><li>- Action research was undertaken this year in the areas of social and emotional wellbeing and behaviour management strategies. Ms Jenny Biancotti, School Social Worker, was thanked for her assistance and engagement in this process.</li><li>- In 2020, the Whole School Social and Emotional Program and Behaviour Management Policy will be launched.</li></ul> <p><b>General achievements and acknowledgements:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- In the Bishops' Religious Education testing, the Year 3 and 5 results reflected that 46% and 41% respectively were in the top 20% of all CEWA students; the school mean had improved by 29.0 and 7.0 respectively; and 77% and 78% respectively were above the CEWA mean.</li><li>- Similarly, above average NAPLAN results were achieved – the school was above the National Average, Catholic Schools and Like-Catholic Schools. This was in all areas of numeracy, reading, writing, grammar, punctuation and spelling.</li><li>- A before and after-school hours care program will commence in the beginning of the 2020 school year.</li></ul>	



- In 2020, the uniform shop will change to an off-site shop accessible six days a week, with late night trading, online ordering and home delivery as available options. The work of Mrs Bronwyn Ryan over the past five years in the Uniform Shop was acknowledged and appreciation was expressed for her assistance with the smooth transition.
- The school is full to capacity with an enrolment of 730 students from Kindergarten to Year 6 for 2020.
- Gratitude was expressed for all within the school community for warm and supportive contributions to the success of our school. Particular mention was made of:
  - o the School Board including contributions made by Graham Forrest who is leaving after serving on the School Board for several years;
  - o the School P&F, including event organisers and class representatives. Special appreciation was made to Richard Boyd who is leaving after many years serving in the P&F and for looking after the St Peters' Dads' initiative.
- Appreciation was expressed to the P&F for their support with the installation of a huge fan in the undercover area, providing cooler comfort during the summer months.
- The P&F also contributed the large eskies to house the lunchboxes; and contributions to the Memorial Garden and Early Childhood play space.
- Gratitude was also expressed to Father Jeronimo for his love, constant support and stewardship of all students and all in the Parish.
- Gratitude was also expressed for Mrs Chris Neville's coordination of the Parish-based sacramental program.
